The Marine Mammal Commission, in consultation with its Committee of Scientific Advisors on Marine Mammals, has reviewed the above-referenced permit application with regard to the goals, policies, and requirements of the Marine Mammal Protection Act.

The applicant is requesting authorization to take by Level B harassment up 112 Atlantic bottlenose dolphins annually over a two-year period. The purpose of the proposed project is to acquire film footage of bottlenose dolphin strand feeding events in the estuaries and creeks of Bull Creek and Hilton Head, South Carolina. The footage would be used in a six-part television series, Earthflight, produced by the British Broadcasting Corporation and the Discovery Channel. The applicant states that the goal of the filming is to capture the animals' natural behavior and indicates that every attempt will be made to avoid disturbing the animals.

RECOMMENDATION

<u>The Marine Mammal Commission recommends</u> that the National Marine Fisheries Service approve the requested permit.

The Commission believes that the activities for which it has recommended approval are consistent with the purposes and policies of the Marine Mammal Protection Act.
